in NSW hospitals, ensuring availability of appropriate skills, training and resources.

The Minimum Standards aim to:



Improve service efficiency

Pre Procedure

Assessment, triage & risk stratification of all patients receiving procedural sedation.



Intra Procedure

Presence of a dedicated clinician with appropriate skills & training (including bag-mask ventilation skills), monitoring & managing the patient's airway & circulation.



Reduce adverse outcomes



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**Post Procedure** 

Appropriate monitoring & application of discharge criteria.



Why safe sedation



- + 300,000 episodes of procedural sedation are performed in NSW each year, increasing every day.
- Significant variation of practice occurs within Local Health Districts (LHDs) and hospitals.
- ➡ Variation in governance arrangements and oversight/support of procedural sedation practice by senior managers and anaesthetic departments.
- Clinical Excellence Commission focus reports.
- Adverse events leading to formal incident reports and root cause analysis.
