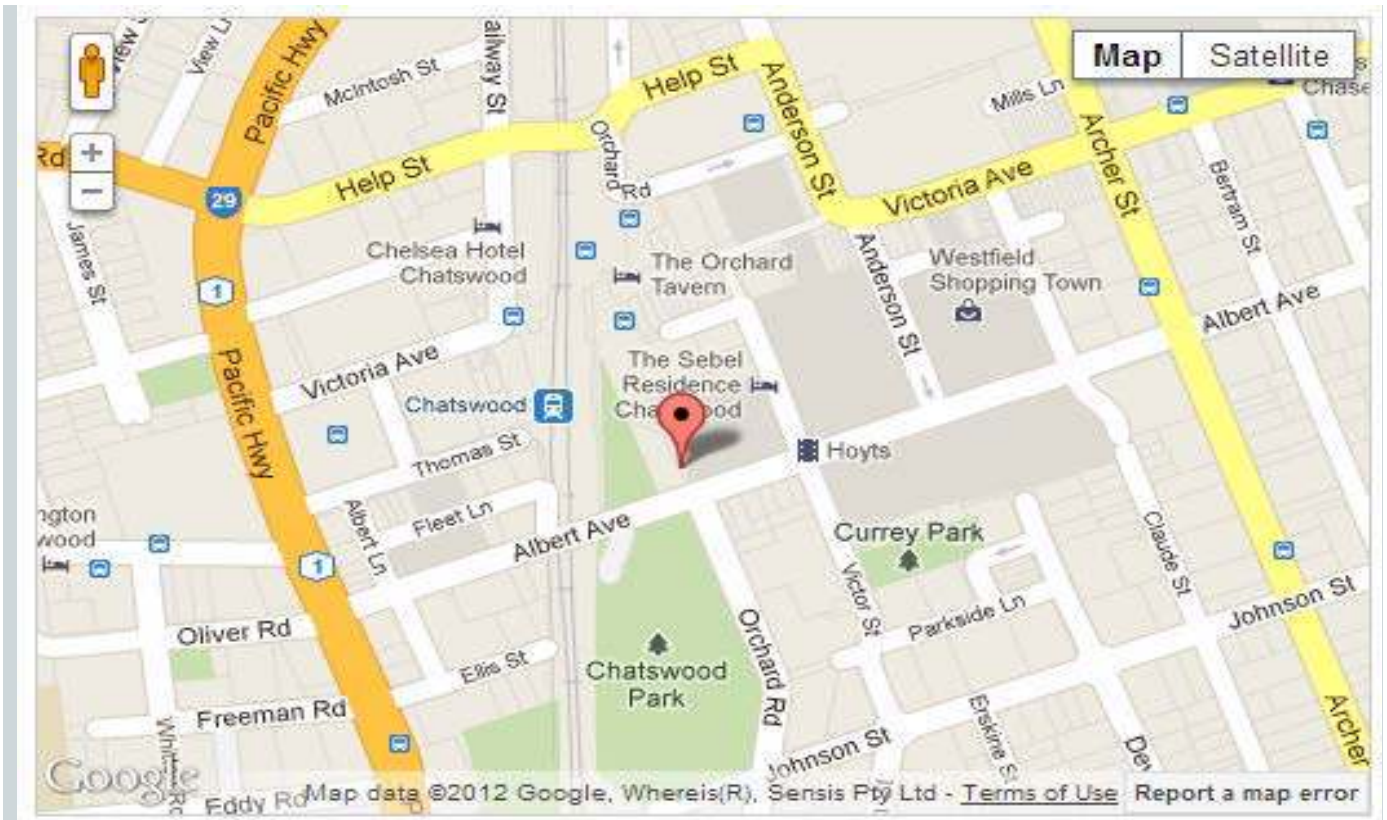

Transport Options:

The Chatswood train station and bus terminals are within walking distance of the building.

Parking options include:

- 1) Mandarin Centre (3 hours free with any purchase eg. Coffee)
- 2) Sage Building (hourly rate)
- 3) Westfield Chatswood (2 hours free, an extra hour with ticket validation)
- 4) The Concourse (enter via Archer Street opposite)
- 5) Chatswood Chase: \$7- 20 for up to 3 hours) Street parking (2 hour timed)
